RULES OF THE HYBRID FAIR

The following guidelines apply to all categories of exhibits.

Steps to Exhibiting

1. **There is no fee to participate in our hybrid fair.** It is open to any resident of Ontario. If you have a membership number from previous years, please use the same number. If you need a membership number, they can be obtained from the Secretary (Jennifer Thompson) by emailing strongagsociety@hotmail.com or by calling 705-384-7110.
2. Entries for all other sections are to be pre-registered on a Strong Agricultural Society entry sheet the entry sheet can be found at the back of this booklet & on The Strong Agricultural Society website (www.strongagriculturalsociety.com). Each person exhibiting needs a form.
3. The Strong Agricultural Society would appreciate entry forms before Friday September 10, 2021.
4. Exhibitors will be notified when tags are ready to be picked up.
5. All entries must be tagged prior to arriving for drop off.
6. Exhibitors can drop off entries Thursday September 16, 2021 between 4:30 p.m. & 7:30 p.m. at the United Church in Sundridge.
7. Entries will be judged on Friday September 17, 2021
8. Only one (1) entry is allowed per membership in each individual section and the same article/exhibit cannot be entered in more than one section.
9. Exhibits are to be picked up at 3:00 p.m. Saturday September 18, 2021 at the Strong Agricultural Society fairgrounds.
10. The Agricultural Society reserves the right to change any of the above guidelines due to changes in government mandated COVID restrictions.

Class 1 – Vegetables

Chairperson: Norm Webb

Prizes - 1st \$20.00 2nd \$10.00 3rd \$5.00

Vegetables must be clean, disease-free and damage-free, with tops trimmed. All displayed vegetable entries must reflect the characteristics of the variety being shown. Entries must meet these criteria to be judged in the competition.

1. Vegetable display 8 varieties, 3 of each, artistically displayed
2. 5 ripe tomatoes- table variety
3. 6 long carrots
4. Giant pumpkin * Pumpkins are to be brought to the grounds Saturday September 18, 2021 by 9:00 a.m.
5. Collection of peppers 3 kinds, 3 of each

Class 2 – Domestic Science

Chairperson: Colleen Anderson

Prizes - 1st \$20.00 2nd \$10.00 3rd \$5.00

RULES:

- a) All exhibits of home baking should be on a Styrofoam tray inside a clear plastic bag, with the exception of cakes, which may be covered with clear plastic wrap.
- b) Staples, straight pins or safety pins must not be used to attach entry tags.
- c) Absolutely no mixes

1. Chocolate Chip Cookies 5 on a disposable plate
2. Best Chocolate Cake, two layers, filled and iced on a disposable plate
3. Best Apple Pie, two crusts in a foil pie plate
4. Best Plain Fudge, 5 pieces, on a disposable plate
5. Best 3 decorated cupcakes on a disposable plate suitable for a child's birthday party
6. 1x500 ml Maple Syrup made locally, non-commercially produced

Class 3 – Canning

Prizes - 1st \$20.00 2nd \$10.00 3rd \$5.00

RULES: ALL PRESERVES, JAMS, JELLIES and PICKLES must be properly

sealed. Jams and Jellies are to be in 250 ml jars with no paraffin.

All other entries to be in pint jars (500mL) unless stated otherwise All jars must be Mason-style.

1. Jam, Raspberry
2. Most unusual Jelly or Jam (not mentioned above) Recipe attached
3. Bread and Butter Pickles
4. Pickled Eggs (750ml)
5. Barbeque Sauce (250ML)

Class 4 – Needlework

Prizes - 1st \$20.00 2nd \$10.00 3rd \$5.00

All entries must be solely made by the exhibitor

Articles will be judged by the standards of the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies, which state:

General Appearance – 25% Design, Colour & Material – 20% Workmanship – 55%

Judges will be cautioned to disqualify SOILED or USED items.

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ODOUR AND SMOKE FREE

Use safety pins only when attaching entry tickets.

1. Crocheted - Stuffed Toy under 10" tall
2. Knitted - 2 Cotton Dishcloths, different patterns
3. Sewing – 2 masks for covid (different designs)
4. Scarf. any medium
5. Miscellaneous - Counted Cross Stitch, framed & completed within the last 2 years

Class 5 - Exceptionalities

All articles must be done by an adult exhibitor within the last 2 years.

1. Hat & Scarf set done by Loom knitting
2. Hooked Rug, any size

Class 6 - Crafts

Prizes - 1st \$20.00 2nd \$10.00 3rd \$5.00

All work must be done by the adult exhibitor

1. Painted/Decorated clay or plastic flowerpot, not to exceed 8" diameter
2. Fall/Thanksgiving door decoration, ready to hang
3. Scrapbooking, any subject, two pages facing, one side only
4. Four Coasters, any medium
5. Any other craft item

Class 7 - Woodworking

Prizes - 1st \$20.00 2nd \$10.00 3rd \$5.00

All work must be done by the adult exhibitor

1. Birdfeeder, suitable to hang or to mount outside
2. Scroll saw item or group of items linked by theme or use
3. Picture frame – without glass or picture
4. Birdhouse
5. Any other item

Class 8 - Adult Photography

Prizes - 1st \$5.00 2nd \$4.00 3rd \$3.00

All work is to be done by the adult exhibitor within the last two years unless otherwise stated.

All photographs are to be printed on photographic paper and mounted on black or white paper, firmly attached and with a minimum of 2 cm around each print.

Write the title on front of tag if one is required.

1. Farm Life - 1 print
2. Family Fun – a collection of family 'snaps' – minimum 4 photos displayed on one sheet of black backing – no scrapbooking please.
3. Something Old – 1 Print of a vehicle or implement
4. A Flower or Plant – One print close up
5. Tell me a Story – Series of 3 photos without captions

Class 9 – Flowers

Prizes - 1st \$20.00 2nd \$10.00 3rd \$5.00

SUGGESTIONS FOR SPECIMEN EXHIBITS Use a vase to display specimen exhibit. Foliage shown will be attached to stems or spike, not shown separate from exhibit. Ensure your bloom(s) is on a stem, above the top of the container, clearly self-supporting. Uniformity in size, colour and maturity are important. Stems are to be strong and straight – even if not visible through the container. Fresh, healthy, disease-free and insect-free specimens picked at their peak of perfection will have the best chance of winning. **SUGGESTIONS FOR ARRANGEMENTS** If the category is an arrangement in a vase – use a vase. For arrangements use a container with or without oasis, wire, sticks, glass, rocks, wood, shells, fabric or ribbons. But all flowers, foliage, fruit or plant material must be grown by exhibitor.

1. Fresh from your Garden – casual bouquet of fresh flowers and foliage in a vase evocative of your garden. Attach a photograph of your garden this year to the entry tag
2. Company Dinner – a table arrangement suitable for a dinner table with candle(s) – low enough for guests to easily see each other, elegantly defining the theme for the dinner.
3. Mellow Yellow – An arrangement that celebrates the colour yellow.
4. Outdoor Planter (container up to 18 inches in diameter)
Mixed herb planter – 3 or more varieties, named
5. House Plants (container up to 14 inches in diameter) Fern any variety – named

Class 10 – Junior Photography

Chairperson: Gail Sawyer

Prizes - 1st \$5.00 2nd \$4.00 3rd \$3.00 4th \$2.00

All work is to be done by the junior exhibitor within the previous two years. The exhibitor is NOT to appear in the photographs. All photographs are to be printed on photographic paper and mounted on paper or cardboard, firmly attached and with a minimum border of 2 cm around the edges.

1. Flowers in the garden, 1 print
2. Farmer's farming, 1 print
3. Autumn Leaves!, 1 print
4. Farmyard friends: feathers or four legs required, 1 print.
5. Lake Bernard at its best, 1 print

Rules for all Junior Categories

1. Age of exhibitor must be as of the first day of the Fair.
2. Each tag will be written by the Secretary. Exhibitor to fill in name and school.
3. An item may be entered in one class ONLY.
4. Exhibitor must compete in their age group ONLY.
5. Articles must be made within the last Fair year.
6. Thank you for your interest in Strong Fall Fair, your adherence to the rules is appreciated.
7. Disqualification is at the discretion of Chairperson or Directors.
